Welcome!

Welcome to the fifth annual Soo Film Festival!

This year we continue to screen films at two downtown venues, giving us an opportunity to show more films and reach more people. Kicking off the festival are two evening programs at Bayliss Public Library, just a block away from the Soo Theatre. Admission to the films at the library is free. The festival continues Friday to Sunday at the Soo Theatre.

The festival places an emphasis on Great Lakes films and filmmakers but, as in previous years, entry was open worldwide. Festival programming will feature international submissions from more than 19 countries.

Returning programs include a late-night horror feature (Friday Night Fright Fest); a feature-length foreign film; and a sci-fi feature. Each of these is accompanied by one or more short films at the beginning of the block.

Other blocks address various themes. The trials and tribulations of relationships are the focus of the Date Night films on Saturday while Sunday's If You Seek a Pleasant Peninsula features a selection of films highlighting Michigan's natural resources.

This year we decided to mix it up with our shorts programs. In each of these, you will see a combination of short narrative and documentary films, as well as animation and music videos. Student work is especially on display and could be your first look at your favorite filmmakers of tomorrow.

All films in every category are eligible for an Audience Award. Judging takes place during the festival. Festivities attendees are encouraged to vote for their favorites.

Thank you for coming out and supporting the festival. We hope you enjoy the films!

Tickets

Tickets and Passes

A Festival Pass is \$50 and gives you admission to all blocks on all days of the festival. A Daily Pass is \$20 and gives you admission to all blocks on a single day (Friday, Saturday, or Sunday). Tickets to a single block are \$7 for general admission and \$5 for students and seniors.

Tickets and passes for the 2018 Soo Film Festival go on sale Friday, September 1. Through September 14 you may purchase all tickets and passes online on the Soo Film Festival website at soofilmfestival.org. This year we are using FilmFreeway's ticketing services to manage online ticket sales.

No tickets are required for films shown at Bayliss Public Library. Admission is free to all films at that venue.

How to Purchase Tickets

Starting September 14, you may purchase tickets and passes at the door. We accept cash, credit cards, and debit cards.

Tickets to individual films will be available at the Soo Theatre 30 minutes before the film start time. You may pick up festival passes at the Soo Theatre 30 minutes before the first screening you wish to attend. If you purchase tickets or passes online, please bring your receipt (printed or viewable on your phone).

Ticket FAQ

If I purchase a single film ticket, do I have a reserved seat?

Single film tickets are reserved for a screening of a specific film with a specific screening time and date; however, having a ticket does not guarantee you a seat. You must arrive at the Soo Theatre at least 15 minutes before the scheduled screening start time.

Are festival passes good for any screening?

Yes; however, please arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the screening you wish to attend to assure yourself the opportunity to secure a seat.

Can ticket purchases be refunded or exchanged?

We regret that tickets cannot be refunded except in the case of a cancelled screening. Exchanges, when possible, will be subject to a \$1.00 processing fee per order.

I lost my tickets. What should I do?

If you have misplaced your Soo Film Festival tickets, please arrive 30 minutes before the screening begins and ask for assistance.

Director Biography: Shane McSauby is a citizen of the Grand Traverse Band of Ottawa and Chippewa Indians, born and raised in Grand Rapids, Michigan. He received a bachelor's degree in filmmaking at Grand Valley State University in Allendale, Michigan in December 2015.

In 2016 Shane became the first Sundance Institute | Native Arts and Cultures Foundation Fellow for his script Mino Bimaadiziwin which included participating in the Sundance Institute's Native Filmmakers Lab in Santa Fe, NM. Mino Bimaadiziwin was completed in October 2017 and is Shane's first short film written and directed since graduating.

In fall of 2018 Shane will be attending NYU Tisch School of Arts as a Dean's Fellow in the graduate film program.


