Welcome to the 2023 Soo Film Festival!

We are celebrating ten years of Great Lakes, Great Movies and are happy you're here with us. That a phone call from Taylor Brugman, our founding president, asking, "What do you think about doing a film festival?" would turn into ten years of wonderful films, new friends, and great memories is just astonishing. It has been a tremendous mix of rewarding and exhausting to put on this festival but we love it and thank you for coming along on this ride.

The challenge is always in selecting the programming, and 2023 was no exception, but we feel we were quite able to execute our mission. The Great Lakes region is well represented by the films and filmmakers and, in fact, this may be the most films we've ever had from Michigan. To sample the wide variety of films across several genres be sure to check out the shorts programs dedicated to the Great Lakes on Friday (Welcome HOMES), Saturday (Made in Michigan), and Sunday (HOMES Documented).

Please, do not miss the student films on Saturday. We particularly encourage student submissions and this could be your first look at your favorite filmmakers of tomorrow. Your support could be instrumental in ensuring they continue to make films in the Great Lakes for years to come.

Our Saturday feature film, Quicksand, is a perfect example of our mission: it was made in and around Traverse City and the Upper Peninsula. It is exactly what we aim to showcase and promote. It's also very funny. Come see what you can make in Michigan with a script, a camera, and your friends. Join us afterward for a Q&A session with director JohnPaul Morris and find out exactly how they did it.

Our documentary features this year all have filmmakers from Michigan and cover a wide variety of topics from wildlife to a rock star performance artist. As varied as they are, they display the resilience that comes from living in the Great Lakes.

The festival begins with two evening programs at Bayliss Public Library, just a block away from the Soo Theatre. Admission to the films at the library is free. The festival continues Friday through Sunday at the Soo Theatre.

Soo Film Festival places an emphasis on Great Lakes films and filmmakers but entry is open worldwide.

All films in every category are eligible for an Audience Award. Festival attendees are encouraged to vote for their favorites.

Thank you for coming out and supporting the festival. We are thrilled to once again welcome you to downtown Sault Ste. Marie for five fantastic days of cinema. We begin this year with a selection of films from around the world and close out with a documentary that could possibly only come from Detroit. We encourage you to explore everything in between, adventure awaits!

Tickets and Passes

A Festival Pass is \$50 and gives you admission to all blocks on all days of the festival. The Festival Super Saver Pass is \$80 and gives you TWO festival passes for one low price! A Daily Pass is \$20 and gives you admission to all blocks on a single day (Friday, Saturday, or Sunday). Tickets to a single block are \$7 for general admission and \$5 for students and seniors.

Tickets and passes for the 2023 Soo Film Festival go on sale August 22. You may purchase all tickets and passes online at the Soo Film Festival ticket page at FilmFreeway. If you purchase tickets or passes online, please bring your receipt (printed or viewable on your phone).

No tickets are required for films shown at Bayliss Public Library. Admission is free to all films at that venue.

Starting September 15, you may purchase tickets and passes at the door. We accept cash, credit cards, and debit cards.

Tickets to individual films will be available at the Soo Theatre 30 minutes before the film start time. You may pick up festival passes at the Soo Theatre 30 minutes before the first screening you wish to attend. If you purchase tickets or passes online, please bring your receipt (printed or viewable on your phone).

TICKET FAQ

If I purchase a single film ticket, do I have a reserved seat?

Single film tickets are reserved for a screening of a specific film with a specific screening time and date; however, having a ticket does not guarantee you a seat. You must arrive at the Soo Theatre at least 15 minutes before the scheduled screening start time.

Are festival passes good for any screening?

Yes; however, please arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the screening you wish to attend to assure yourself the opportunity to secure a seat.

Can ticket purchases be refunded or exchanged?

We regret that tickets cannot be refunded except in the case of a cancelled screening. Exchanges, when possible, will be subject to a \$1.00 processing fee per order.

I lost my tickets. What should I do?

If you have misplaced your Soo Film Festival tickets, please arrive 30 minutes before the screening begins and ask for assistance.




2017), Witched (First Place 2019), and A Kind of Time (2020).

Despite what would seem to be a flourishing career, most recently playing Kermit on Showtime's Shameless, Hollywood character actor Jim Hoffmaster struggles both professionally and personally.

Acting Like Nothing is Wrong explores how he navigates life without a stable upbringing. Foster care and abuse lead Jim to acting, where he could finally be seen and appreciated.

The film poses universal questions and illuminates mental health issues we experience on a daily basis. Do we ever completely overcome our traumas? What are our coping mechanisms?

DIRECTOR BIOGRAPHY



Jane Rosemont is an award-winning filmmaker and photographer. Her debut film Pie Lady of Pie Town, narrated by Academy Award winner Wes Studi, premiered in Hollywood in June 2014. It has been an official selection in over 45 festivals, winning 18 awards including Best Short Documentary, Best Music, and Best Director.

Jane was born in Detroit, Michigan, the youngest of eight happy children. After dragging her feet through college and holding jobs without passion, she met an Olympus

OM2 that gave her the focus she lacked and desperately craved. Her photography has been exhibited and published across the USA for four decades. A book of black and white portraits entitled Saving Faces was published in 1996.

Proud and grateful to be a two-time cancer survivor, she lives in Santa Fe, New Mexico with her husband Dick. Dick Rosemont produced Pie Lady of Pie Town and is the subject of Jane's short-short film Shirts! He is executive producer of Acting Like Nothing is Wrong. Dick buys and sells vinyl records as "The Guy in the Groove," is a music researcher, writer, presenter, and archivist.

Acting Like Nothing is Wrong, an intimate portrait of actor Jim Hoffmaster, is about survival and reinvention in a world that did not offer love or stability. Complex and compelling, Jim's story incorporates humor and hope despite his difficult upbringing.

For years, Jim and I both lived in Michigan but knew each other only casually. Fifteen years ago, during one of my trips to Los Angeles where he had moved to pursue an acting career, we reconnected. As we got to know each other, I became increasingly captivated by the convoluted chain of events in his life. I was raised in a stable, loving home, the youngest of eight spirited children. Hearing Jim relay childhood abandonment, abuse, and loneliness was akin to reading Charles Dickens.


My decision to make the film came quickly while I was at a film festival, viewing a documentary that focused on a foster child. I vowed to offer another voice to the widespread failure of the 1960s foster care system. I was determined to craft a film that respectfully exposed the details of this particular foster child, as well as present unexpected humor to balance the story.

During the process of filming, I would often take advantage of making photos of Jim. As a photographer for over three decades, how could I not take advantage of his malleable face? At the time, I did not realize that they would become vital elements in the film itself.

While Jim presents strength and confidence to the public, he continues to struggle with anxiety and destructive patterns learned from childhood. To help overcome low self-esteem, he mastered acting skills and a wry sense of humor. "The reason acting worked for me is because I was noticed. I was being seen. I hadn't felt that before."

Jim's lighthearted dancing and comedic timing play throughout this film of survival. I am eager to share his narrative and feel hopeful the film will be an inspiration to anyone who has, or knows someone who has, dealt with any level of mental health issues.





On November 27th, 1872, the schooner barges *Jupiter* and *Saturn* broke their tow lines and went aground west of Whitefish Point. Fifteen people died that day, fifteen souls who were never seen again.

This special mini-documentary looks back on that tragic day. Also, you'll meet a family who finally found out what happened to their ancestor on the day he died over 150 years ago in the Great Storm of 1872.

This western U.P. high school, with fewer than two dozen students per grade, has built a basketball tradition that has captured the eyes of sportswriters and the dreams of young ballplayers for generations. And it all began in a unique gymnasium known as The Barn.

After years of creative frustration and burnout, Earlybird flew out of my fingers, through my keyboard, and onto a screenplay. I seasoned it with my guilt, my feelings on collaboration (and "the auteur"), a series of run-on sentences, and I tried to make it funny. I hope people enjoy watching it as much as we enjoyed making it.


As is so often true about the independent filmmaker, Earlybird explores how those who work in theater define themselves by their

output and the reception of their work. Each character shows they have lost their patience and now, threadbare from too many long nights and too little material success, they are at odds with each other. In this film, we explore how our culture of constant grinding (not limited to the arts) pushes people to lose their humanity. It isn't just our protagonist Michael who forgets to consider the feelings and needs of the people around him. In this film, our goal is to show how difficult it is to live well when you're living for the attention and approval of the ever-elusive kudo.

As an artist, I have struggled at times with the balance of commerce and art. Not just for financial gain, but within the art I make. As the term "content" becomes more prevalent in relation to art, I feel Earlybird's focus on the balance between work, art, and life becomes more and more pertinent. The film's theme of workplace culture within the arts is also more relevant than ever, given the

seemingly daily reveal of toxic work environments in collaborative art-making.

Mark Lawrence Finnell is a Detroit, Michigan native. After living in San Francisco for a time, Mark took the unusual route of returning to university at the age of 29

He graduated from West Virginia University with a BA/BFA in 1995. He was then awarded a full scholarship and graduated with an MFA in Performance (Acting and Directing) from the Hilberry Repertory Theatre at Wayne State University (Detroit) in 1998.

After 12 years in Los Angeles working as a professional actor, marketing professional, and corporate facilitator/trainer for automotive manufacturers, he returned to Michigan in 2010. His first foray into writing, producing, and directing for film was his own Restoration Dogs, "a transformative adaptation" set in 1670s London from his stage play.



He also wrote the screenplay, acted in, and directed a short film, Dog Tag, about a father

who refuses to believe that his son died in Iraq. This short film screened at many Michigan venues.

In addition, Mark wrote, directed, and produced three silent short films with Satori Circus that have screened at various film festivals in Michigan.

He has written, directed, and produced his first feature-length independent documentary film: Being Satori Circus ~ A Performance Documentary in Five Acts about Detroit's performance artist, Satori Circus.

Mark continues to work as a facilitator, actor, voice-over artist, teacher, and coach and resides just outside of Detroit in Ferndale, Michigan, with his wife of 24 years, Tina Gloss-Finnell.

DIRECTOR STATEMENT

Being Satori Circus ~ A Performance Documentary in Five Acts is a Hybrid Documentary using performative aspects. Just as the character of Satori Circus is a performance artist, so I sought to give a performance quality to a nonfiction documentary on this subject. The performative nature includes live (concert) performances, as well as fictional elements to fill out the artist's life.

Being Satori Circus seeks to share the subculture that has evolved around this performance artist over the last 34 years in Detroit, Michigan. I want to take my audience on an entertaining journey and show what is unique and mysterious about Satori Circus. What is performance art? How did it all begin? How does Satori Circus define who he is? What is his 'Being'?

We explore his early years, how he has morphed into what he has become, and how others involved in this artistic community "see" him. We look at how

photographers see him, the meaning of his ever-changing make-up, what has influenced him, and how he is a cultural part of the city that formed him: Detroit. Also, the documentary shows and informs all the various aspects of what he does.

We also explore the continuing nature of what his art is through live performance and the diverse viewpoints of those who know him, as well as Satori Circus in his own words. This relatively unknown and certainly unsung artist's aspects and journey is told in part by the filmmaker himself as the audience is led through this experience of discovery.




